The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored flagship for public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year in 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges and Universities. In session 2016-17, NSS unit of college has registered 100 students from different classes and category as per the letter (Ref. No.: NSS/127/2016-17 dated on 24.10.2016) and guidelines received from Vice Chancellor and President of National Service Scheme of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur. BLOOD DONATION CAMP

India faces a blood shortage of 3 million units. The problem can be addressed if an additional two percent of Indians donate blood, as opened by the Health experts. We need 12 million units of blood every year but just about nine million units are being donated. Our College has been religiously organizing blood donation camps every year and students and the faculty members come forward voluntarily to donate blood. While addressing to people at the camp our NSS volunteers brought awareness in them about shortage of blood and why we must donate blood every year, to help the persons requiring blood. Blood donation can save lives of innumerable persons. Donation of blood is very critical and crucial for saving lives many patients and those who have met with accidents. It is as such a great service or contribution to the society and people living in it. Blood donation and blood group detection camp was organized on 1st Jan 2017. Dr. R. O. Ganjiwale, Principal was the president of programme. Team of experts from Datta Meghe Institute of Medical Sciences, Sawangi(Meghe), Wardha was present on the occasion. About 23 students of the institute donated blood. Programme was conducted under the banner of NSS regular activities. Dr. Sunil C. Chawre was Camp In-charge for Blood Bank J.N.M.C. Sawangi(Meghe).
