ADMISSION PROCEDURE

I. Undergraduate:

A) FIRST YEAR BACHLOR OF PHARMACY:

Sanctioned Intake Capacity – 60

- a. State CET Cell, Mumbai, is a competent authority for admission to B. Pharm course in the State of Maharashtra. Competent authority every year conducts a Common Entrance Test (CET) for B. Pharm.
- b. Once the Notification for admission to B. Pharm are placed on print, all the CET/NEET qualified students (Maharashtra State / OMS / All India Level Candidates) has to register on-line (www.cetcell.mahacet.org) through CET cell approved Facilitation/Scrutiny centers for Centralized Admission Process (CAP).
- c. IPER is an approved Facilitation/Scrutiny Centre (FC/SC) by the regulatory body.
- d. All types of candidates seeking admissions to B. Pharm under CAP/Institute Level (IL) must register and get documents verified at designated FC/SC centre.
- e. The inter-se-merit list is published on the website by competent authority on the basis of CET/NEET score.
- f. The seats are allotted on-line on the basis of *inter-se-merit* for CAP I, CAP II and CAP III rounds.
- g. Students have to fill the Options/choices online through their login.
- h. The provisional allotment of CAP is displayed on website as per the published schedule.
- i. The candidates report to allotted Institute and confirm the admission along with original documents and fees.
- j. Vacant seats, if any, after CAP III round are filled by the institute after putting advertisement in print-media.
- k. After accepting the applications, institute level merit list is prepared after sorting the applications and the admissions are made by personal counseling. The vacant seats are filled in by the Candidate from the same Category for which it was earmarked during the CAP. Further if the seats remain vacant then the seat is filled on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the applicants.

- 1. Institute constitutes admission committee for smooth conduction of admission procedure.
- m. The students are well informed about the rules and policies related to admission & the same are displayed on Notice Board and in the brochure of Institute.
- n. Closure of admission procedure is as per the cut-off date declared by the Competent Authority.

B) DIRECT SECOND YEAR BACHLOR OF PHARMACY

Admissions are done through Centralized Admission Procedure (CAP) run by Government of Maharashtra, State Common Entrance Test Cell, Mumbai on the basis of Diploma Score. If seats remain vacant after Centralised Admission Procedure, admissions are done by the Management at the Institute level.

II. Postgraduate:

A) FIRST YEAR MASTER OF PHARMACY: Sanctioned Intake Capacity – 45

- a. The admissions to M. Pharm. are also carried out through entrance examination, Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA).
- b. State CET Cell, Mumbai, is a competent authority for admission to M. Pharm course in the State of Maharashtra.
- c. Once the Notification for admission to B. Pharm are placed on print, all the GPAT appeared students (Maharashtra State / OMS / All India Level Candidates) has to register on-line (www.cetcell.mahacet.org) through CET cell approved Facilitation/Scrutiny centers for Centralized Admission Process (CAP).
- d. The Merit list is prepared on the basis of GPAT score conducted by NTA
- e. All CAP rounds are conducted by State CET Cell.

- f. Allotment in CAP Round-I, II and III of Home University Seats /Other than Home University seats/ State Level seats will be carried out as per *inter se* merit of candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature. Seats will be allotted to candidates as per *inter* se merit, options filled and seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAP Round-I, II and III.
- g. Vacant seats if any are filled by Institute level round of students appeared in GPAT.

III. Doctor of Philosophy:

- a. Similarly Ph. D. admissions are on the basis of GPAT.
- b. For GPAT non-qualified candidates, PAT test conducted by RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur is compulsory.
- c. While giving admission, the care is taken to give equal opportunity to all students irrespective of his/her religion, caste, creed and sex.
- d. The entire admission process is governed by the reservation policy of government.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

A) First Year Bachelor of Pharmacy

(1) Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates

- i. The candidate should be an Indian National
- ii. Passed HSC or its equivalent examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the Mathematics or Biology and obtained at least 45% marks (at least 40% marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with Disability belonging only to Maharashtra State) in the above subjects taken together ;
- iii. Should have appeared in all the subjects and should obtain non zero score in CET conducted by Competent Authority.

(2) All India Candidature Candidates

- i. The candidate should be an Indian National;
- Passed HSC or its equivalent examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the Mathematics or Biology and obtained at least 45% marks (at least 40% marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories, Economically

Weaker Section and Persons with Disability belonging only to Maharashtra State) in the above subjects taken together ;

iii. Should obtain non zero positive score in NEET or the candidate should have appeared in all the subjects in CET and should obtain non zero score in CET conducted by Competent Authority. However preference shall be given to the candidate obtaining non zero positive score in NEET over the candidates who obtained non zero score in CET.

(3) NRI / OCI / PIO, Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries, Foreign National Candidature Candidates

- i. The candidate should have passed the HSC or its equivalent examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the Mathematics or Biology, and obtained at least 45 % marks in the above subjects taken together
- ii. Any other criterion declared from time to time by the appropriate authority as defined under the Act.

B) Direct Second Year (Lateral Entry) Admission- for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates and All India Candidature Candidates

- i. The Candidate should be an Indian National;
- ii. Passed Diploma Course in Pharmacy with at least 45% marks (at least 40% marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with disability belonging to Maharashtra State only) from an All India Council for Technical Education or Pharmacy Council of India or Central or State Government approved Institution or its equivalent.
- iii. Any other criterion declared from time to time by the appropriate authority as defined under the Act.

C) First Year Master of Pharmacy

1) For Maharashtra Candidature Candidates and All India Candidature Candidates:

- i. The candidate should be an Indian National;
- ii. Passed Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy from any All India Council for Technical Education or Pharmacy Council of India or Central or State Government approved institution, with at least 55% marks (at least 50% marks in case of Backward Class category, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with Disability Candidates

belonging to Maharashtra State); The Candidates should have registration with State Pharmacy Council. The candidates not having registration should produce the registration certificate within one month after securing admission.

- iii. Obtained non zero positive score in Graduates Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) conducted by National Testing Agency;
- iv. For sponsored candidates, minimum of two years of full time work experience in a registered firm/ company/industry/ educational and/ or research institute/ any Government Department or Government Autonomous Organization in the relevant field in which admission is being sought.
- (2) Children of NRI / OCI / PIO, Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries, Foreign National Candidature Candidates
- Passed Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy from any All India Council for Technical Education or Pharmacy Council of India or Central or State Government approved institution, with at least 55% marks.
- ii. Any other criterion declared from time to time by the appropriate authority as defined under the Act.
